**Date:** Thursday, September 21, 2023

MATA will provide continuous shuttles from 6:00am until 8:30am and 2:00pm until 4:00pm from the host hotel, the Sheraton Downtown Memphis.

As you know, the Bus, Van and Maintenance Roadeo is a great opportunity to provide some well-deserved operator and maintenance personnel recognition while promoting safety and professionalism. Transit systems throughout Tennessee send the best bus, van operators and maintenance professionals to compete in this event. The competing maintenance personnel compete in a variety of categories testing their industry knowledge. The Maintenance Roadeo handbook is available on the conference website, the link is located on the TPTA website(tntransit.org). The competing bus and van operators drive through a test course marked with traffic cones that simulate various situations encountered on the road. Competing bus and van operators and maintenance personnel are expected to meet Roadeo qualifications by maintaining good attendance and a safe driving record.

this year the pre-trip inspection portion of the competition will be held the day of the roadeo. By doing this it allows the operators to participate in the conference expo and sessions on Wednesday. We will review the details during the operator orientation.

The Roadeo will consist of seven (5) separate competitions:

- 30-foot Bus Competition
- Conversion Van Competition
- Cutaway Van Competition
- Bus Maintenance Competition
- Van Maintenance Competition

**NEW**-Each TPTA transit system member is entitled to send three (3) operators and two (2) maintenance personnel per competition. Competitors can only compete in one category. All participants must be qualified and possess a valid driver's license or Commercial Driver's License (CDL) for the vehicle in which they are competing. **2022 TPTA State Roadeo winners can be found in Appendix 1; Frequently asked questions and answers can be found in Appendix 2.**

#### **OPERATOR COURSE EVENTS:**

The eleven (11) driving problems or tests are worth 50 points each. Event descriptions are included in Appendix 3. Reckless use of equipment and flagrant disregard for the safety of others may result in immediate disqualification.

#### 1. Offset Street

This test requires the contestant to drive through two separate narrow lanes that are offset one full lane's width from each other:

- Points will be deducted for:
  - touching cones,
  - o shifting into reverse, or
  - Not completing course as designed

#### 2. Right Hand Reverse

This problem tests the contestant's ability to turn a vehicle around at a route terminal which requires the vehicle to back up to the right:

- Points will be deducted for:
  - o touching cones,
  - o shifting into reverse after the initial reverse,
  - o Rear clearance beyond 36 inches, or
  - Not completing the course as designed

#### 3. Right Turn

This problem tests the contestant's ability to negotiate a tight 90° turn. The corner is marked with cones and the right rear tire of the bus is to pass within 6 inches of the corner cone:

- Points will be deducted for:
  - o touching cones,
  - o shifting into reverse,
  - o Excessive right rear tire clearance, or
  - Not completing course as designed

#### 4. Serpentine

This problem tests the contestant's ability to negotiate tight turns. The driver enters the course through a "gate," weaves in and out through three cones and exits the course through a "gate:"

- Points will be deducted for:
  - o touching cones,
  - o shifting into reverse, or
  - Not completing course as designed

#### 5. Left Hand Turn

This problem tests the contestant's ability to make a tight left turn in a close situation. The contestant is required to swing the vehicle into a good turn without touching any of the cones:

- Points will be deducted for:
  - o touching cones,
  - o shifting into reverse after the initial reverse,
  - Not completing the course as designed

#### 6. Customer Stop

This event simulates a customer stop. The contestant stops the vehicle with the front tires within 6 inches of the simulated curb. Rear tires must be within 15 inches of the simulated curb. After stopping the vehicle, the operator opens the door to complete the test. An ADA stop announcement must be made prior to exiting the passenger stop:

- Points will be deducted for:
  - touching cones and or "curb",
  - o Front tire measurement over 6 inches,
  - o Rear tire measurement over 15 inches,
  - o shifting into reverse, or
  - Not completing the course as designed

#### 7. Left-Hand Reverse

This problem tests the contestant's ability to turn a vehicle around at a route terminal which requires the vehicle to back up to the left:

- Points will be deducted for:
  - touching cones,
  - o shifting into reverse after the initial reverse,
  - Rear clearance beyond 36 inches, or
  - Not completing the course as designed

#### 8. Customer Stop

This event simulates a customer stop. The contestant stops the vehicle with the front tires within 6 inches of the simulated curb. Rear tires must be within 15 inches of the simulated curb. After stopping the vehicle, the operator opens the door to complete the test. An ADA stop announcement must be made prior to exiting the passenger stop:

- Points wil | I be deducted for:
  - o touching cones and or "curb",
  - Front tire measurement over 6 inches,
  - o Rear tire measurement over 15 inches,
  - shifting into reverse, or
  - Not completing the course as designed

#### 9. Rear Duals Clearance

This is a judgment problem where the contestant must drive through a lane with the right dual tires. The lane is only slightly wider than the total outside width of a pair of rear duals and is with large flat washers and tennis balls. The lane diminishes in width from the entrance to the exit:

- Points will be deducted for:
  - o touching balls,
  - shifting into reverse,
  - Not completing the course as designed

#### 10. Diminishing Clearance

This problem tests the contestant's ability to judge the position and speed of his/her vehicle. The contestant is required to drive through a narrowing V-shaped channel outlined with barrels while maintaining a minimum speed of 15 miles per hour:

- Points will be deducted for:
  - touching barrels,
  - o speed below 15 MPH
  - Not completing the course as designed

#### 11. Judgment Stop

This event tests the contestant's ability to judge closing distances between the bus and a small object directly ahead. A small cone is placed on the final stop. The contestant must stop with the front bumper or bike rack within 6 inches of the cone:

- Points will be deducted for:
  - o touching cone,
  - Excessive total stops,
  - o Excessive clearance beyond 6-inch limit, or
  - o Not completing the course as designed

#### **OTHER SCORED EVENTS:**

#### 1. Safety Habits

- Contestant's safety habits will be reviewed while operating the vehicle.
- This event category is worth 25 points.
- Points will be deducted for:
  - o Failure to use proper turn signals,
  - Failure to sound horn before backing up,
  - Failure to use flashers while backing up,
  - Moving vehicle with door open,
  - Poor posture,
  - o Poor use of mirrors,
  - o Poor use of hands, or
  - o Poor use of feet

#### 2. Smoothness of Operation

- Contestant's ability to deliver a smooth ride will be evaluated during the driving events.
- This event category is worth 25 points.
- Points will be deducted for:
  - o Failure to make A.D.A. announcements,
  - Sudden stops,
  - o Sudden starts, or
  - o Abrupt turns

#### 3. Personal Appearance

- The contestant's personal appearance will be evaluated for neatness, cleanliness and professionalism. The contestant must report wearing the uniform appropriate for his/her transit system.
- This event category is worth 50 points.
- Points will be deducted for:
  - Wrinkled, dirty, incomplete uniform,
  - Unpolished or dirty shoes, or,
  - Unkempt personal appearance

#### 4. Total Course Time

- Contestants are timed for each driving course event. Timing begins when the contestant begins the course and ends with the completion of the last event.
- Time is stopped for mechanical trouble, any type of course blockage that would impede contestant progress and where measurements are required for event scoring.
- Points are deducted for each second over seven (7) minutes required to complete the course.
- A maximum of 10 minutes will be allowed to complete the course

Competitors will be required to vacate the course after 10 minutes.

#### PRE-TRIP INSPECTION:

All competitors operating the 30-foot bus in the Roadeo will conduct the pre-trip inspection on a bus. All van operators will conduct the pre-trip inspection on a conversion van. All competitors will be provided with a pre-trip card, pencil and a clip board to conduct the pre-trip inspection. The pre-trip card provides a guide on one side and areas to list all defects on the other side.

#### a. Defects:

- Six (6) equipment-related defects and (1) security hazards are planted on or in a bus/van. These defects would make a bus operationally unready or unsafe.
- Defects are of a type that an operator would find when performing a pre-trip inspection.
- Identification of defects does not require starting the bus or crawling under the bus.
- Operators will not be allowed to have a checklist of defects to refer to during the competition.
- Eligible defects might include broken, loose, bad, missing, or incorrect:

o seats

o windows

flooring

windshield

o mirrors

doors

o bell cord

all type of lights

stanchions

fire extinguisher

wipers

o number

license plate

o horn

And a security hazard such as an abandoned package or briefcase etc.

- Ineligible defects include:
  - o defects under the bus
  - o exterior body damage
  - o paint problems
  - o radios
  - o fare boxes
  - o destination signs
  - battery compartment
  - o wheelchair operations
  - kneeling functions
- Equipment where multiple defects are possible will be counted only once, i.e., seats, windows, lights.
- Front and rear windows, headlights, tail lights, brake lights, mirrors, and turn signals will each count as separate defects.

#### b. Time:

- Each operator will be allotted seven (7) minutes to inspect, locate, identify, and legibly record any defects found.
- Time warnings will be given to the individual at the two (2) minute, one (1) minute, and 30 second time marks.
- Recording defects and securing doors will not be allowed after time has elapsed.

#### c. Scoring:

- Five (5) points will be awarded for each of six (6) planted defects found, and twenty (20) points will be awarded for one (1) planted security challenge for a maximum of fifty (50) points.
- Points will be awarded only for those recorded defects that were planted by the judges. No points will be awarded for identification of defects which were not planted.
- The operator will notify the judge when finished. Once notice is given, the operator may not list additional defects.
- The judge will review the list of defects with each operator for clarification.
- A penalty of one (1) point will be assessed for each instance where the bus is not returned to its original condition; for example, one (1) point assessed for lights left on, wipers left running, master switch on, windows open, and escape hatches open, etc.
- Starting the bus or van constitutes a safety violation and will result in the operator being disqualified from this event. The inspection bus/van will be supplied with necessary electrical power and air pressure.

#### **OPERATOR SCORING:**

(Operator Score Sheets can be found in Appendix 4)

#### **Driving Competition:**

- 1. The conversion van and cutaway van, and 30' bus competitions are five (3) separate competitions.
- 2. There will be a first, second and third place award in each competition.
- 3. There are **700** maximum points for each competition.
- 4. 50 points will be deducted for obstacles attempted in the wrong order.
- 5. Ten (10) points will be deducted for any course marker not associated with an event (obstacle) touched.
- 6. The full value of the event (obstacle) will be deducted for any event not attempted or completed as designed.
- 7. In case of tie, the tie breakers will be as follows
  - a. Lowest time on the course
  - b. Score on the Judgment Stop.
- 8. Judgment of events (obstacles) will be the responsibility of the Event Judges. All decisions made by Event Judges are final.
- 9. Procedural questions must be directed to appropriate On-field Roadeo Officials.
- 10. Contestants are only allowed on the course when competing.
- 11. Contestants are not permitted to talk to Event Judges at any time during the competition.
- 12. Enforcement of all Roadeo "Rules and Regulations," supervision of Event Judges, and on-the-spot procedural decisions will be the responsibility of the Roadeo Officials.

#### Tennessee Public Transportation Association Van Roadeo Pre-Trip Guide

#### **DEFECTS**

Six equipment-related defects and (1) security hazard planted on or in the bus. These defects would make a bus operationally unready or unsafe. Defects are of a type that an operator would find when performing a pre-trip inspection. Identification of defects does not require starting the bus or crawling under the bus. Operators will not be allowed to have a checklist of defects to refer to during the competition.

#### **ELIGIBLE DEFECTS may include: (6 defects- 5 points each)**

Seats, windows, flooring, windshield, mirrors, doors, bell cord, all type of lights, stanchions, fire extinguisher, wipers, bus number, and license plates

#### **SECURITY HAZARD (1 security hazard- 20 points)**

A security hazard such as an abandoned package or briefcase will be planted on or in the bus.

#### **MULTIPLE DEFECTS**

Equipment where multiple defects are possible will be counted only once. Seats, Windows, and Lights. Front and Rear Windows, Headlights, Tail-Lights, Brake Lights, Mirrors and Turn Signals will each count as separate defects.

#### **INELIGIBLE DEFECTS**

Defects under the bus, Exterior Body Damage, Paint Problems, Wheelchair Operations, Kneeling functions, Radio, Fare box, Destination Signs, Battery Compartment, etc.

#### **SAFETY VIOLATION**

Starting the bus constitutes a Safety Violation and will result in the operator being disqualified from this event. The Inspection bus will be supplied with necessary electrical power and air pressure.

#### **LEAVE IT AS YOU FOUND IT**

Points will be assessed for Lights left on, Wipers left running, Master Switch on, Windows Open, and Escape Hatches open, etc.

#### TIME

Each operator will be allotted seven (7) minutes to Inspect, Locate, Identify, and Legibly Record any defects found. Points will be awarded only for those recorded defects that were planted by the judges. No points will be awarded for identification of defects which were not planted. Recording defects and securing doors will not be allowed after time has elapsed.

#### **SCORING**

The Operator will notify the judge when finished. Once notice is given, the Operator may not list additional defects. The judge will review the list of Defects with each Operator for clarification. A penalty of one (1) point will be assessed for each instance where the bus is not returned to its original condition: for example, one (1) point assessed for Lights left on, Wipers left running, Master switch on, Windows open, and Escape Hatches Open, etc.

#### **DEFECTS**

Six equipment-related defects and (1) security hazard planted on or in the bus. These defects would make a bus operationally unready or unsafe. Defects are of a type that an operator would find when performing a pre-trip inspection. Identification of defects does not require starting the bus or crawling under the bus. Operators will not be allowed to have a checklist of defects to refer to during the competition.

#### **ELIGIBLE DEFECTS may include: (6 defects- 5 points each)**

Seats, windows, flooring, windshield, mirrors, doors, bell cord, all type of lights, stanchions, fire extinguisher, wipers, bus number, and license plates

#### SECURITY HAZARD (1security hazard- 20 points)

A security hazard such as an abandoned package or briefcase will be planted on or in the bus.

#### **MULTIPLE DEFECTS**

Equipment where multiple defects are possible will be counted only once. Seats, Windows, and Lights. Front and Rear Windows, Headlights, Tail-Lights, Brake Lights, Mirrors and Turn Signals will each count as separate defects.

#### **INELIGIBLE DEFECTS**

Defects under the bus, Exterior Body Damage, Paint Problems, Wheelchair Operations, Kneeling functions, Radio, Fare box, Destination Signs, Battery Compartment, etc.

#### **SAFETY VIOLATION**

Points will be assessed for Lights left on, Wipers left running, Master Switch on, Windows Open, and Escape Hatches open, etc.

#### TIME

Each operator will be allotted seven (7) minutes to Inspect, Locate, Identify, and Legibly Record any defects found. Points will be awarded only for those recorded defects that were planted by the judges. No points will be awarded for identification of defects which were not planted. Recording defects and securing doors will not be allowed after time has elapsed.

#### **SCORING**

The Operator will notify the judge when finished. Once notice is given, the Operator may not list additional defects. The judge will review the list of Defects with each Operator for clarification. A penalty of one (1) point will be assessed for each instance where the bus is not returned to its original condition: for example, one (1) point assessed for Lights left on, Wipers left running, Master Switch on, Windows open, and Escape Hatches Open, etc.

### **APPENDIX 2**

#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS & ANSWER

NOTE: Questions and answers are provided to assist Roadeo contestants with familiarization of the Roadeo competition. On-field officials are responsible for inte1pretations and decisions during competition.

#### 1. Q: Can someone ride with me?

A: No.

#### 2. Q: Are you going to guide me through the course?

A: No. You will be provided with a diagram of the course and/or a walk-through. It is your responsibility to negotiate the obstacles in proper order.

#### 3. Q: Do I have to use the horn and turn signals?

A: Yes. If you fail to use your horn and/or signals, you will lose points from the on-board safety judge.

#### 4. Q: Am I allowed to go outside the line of the perimeter cones?

A: No. You must stay within the course lines. Each course marker or perimeter cone touched will count as a penalty.

#### 5. Q: May I take off my jacket when I compete?

A: Yes. Make yourself comfortable after the personal appearance inspection.

#### 6. Q: Can I use the mirrors that I am used to?

A: No. You must use the mirrors provided on the host property vehicles.

#### 7. Q:Will I be driving the same type of bus that I drive in my system?

A: You will be driving the vehicles provided by the host property for the vans or bus competition. Vehicle information is provided in the Host property information in description of buses & vans .

#### 8. Q: Will there be transportation from the Hotel to the Roadeo site?

A: Yes. Refer to the TPTA Roadeo Schedule or TPTA website for additional information.

#### 9. Q: Do I have to take a safety quiz?

A: No.

#### 10. Q: Do I go through the defect bus?

A: Yes. The Operator competition includes a scored pre-trip inspection.

#### 11. Q: Do I get a personal appearance inspection?

A: Yes.

#### 12. Q: May I adjust my mirrors?

A: Yes. You are responsible for adjusting your mirrors.

#### 13. Q: Dollose points if I back up?

A: Yes. In all course events except for the first backup in the left and right reverses, you will lose points each time you reverse.

#### 14. Q:IfIhit the same cone twice, do lose double points?

A: No. Once you are charged with hitting a cone you are not charged for it the second time.

#### 15. Q: If I just touch the base of a cone does it count against me?

A: Yes. Hitting or even touching any portion of the cone counts as a hit.

#### 16. Q: Is my manager allowed to walk behind my bus when I am competing?

A: No. Only Roadeo Officials and judges are allowed on the course while competition (or practice) is in progress. Spectators may watch from the spectator areas.

#### 17. Q: Will I be allowed to walk through the course?

A: Yes. On competition day all Roadeo participates will get a walk through to observe the course.

#### 18. Q: Does time on the course count?

A: Yes. The course time limit is seven (7) minutes. Points will be deducted for every second over seven (7) minutes.

#### 19. Q: Does smoothness of operation count?

A: Yes. You will be observed by the On-Board Judge.

#### 20. Q: Does speed count?

A: Your speed through the diminishing clearance obstacle must be at least 15 mph.

#### 21. Q: Do you award dual prizes for a tie score?

A: No. The contestant with the lowest time through the course wins.

#### 22. Q: How many prizes are awarded?

A: First, Second and third prizes will be awarded for each category that competes.

#### 23. Q: Do I have to wear my badge or name plate?

A: Only if it's part of your uniform.

#### 24. Q: Can I wear sneakers?

A: Wear the same kind of shoes you wear when you are operating in passenger service at your transit system.

#### 25. Q: Will there be refreshments/lunch?

A: Refreshments and lunch will be available on competition day.

#### 26. Q: Can I bring my family?

A: Yes. Come and enjoy the festivities and competition. Spectator areas are available for the Operators course.

#### 27. Q: Do I have to come to orientation?

A: Yes. Important information will be put out at orientation as well as placement in the competition.

#### 28. Q: Do I have to use a seat belt?

A: Yes. 5 Points will be deducted for failure to use your seat belt.

#### 29. Q. Is the course set up as shown in the APTA handbook?

A: Obstacle configurations are the same, but dimensions and sequence may be different.

#### 30. Q: How is the decision made about which category bus goes first each year?

A: In odd number years 35-' buses go first. In even years 40+' buses go first.

#### 31. Q: Is the rear cone in the backups fixed or does it vary?

A: The rear cone is fixed.

#### 32. Q: Will there be a bus available for familiarization purposes?

A: Not sure. On the day of orientation or on competition day 30', 35' and 40' buses and van will be available.

#### 33. Q: Do I only have to call ADA announcements at the passenger stops?

A: Yes. You must call the stop before you start forward movement out of the bus stop.

#### 34. Q: Do I need to use the P.A. (Public Announcement) System to announce ADA Stops?

A: No.

#### 35. Q: On the Right and Left reverses do I start at a 45-degree angle?

A: You can start at whatever angle you prefer.

#### 36. Q: Do the buses have bike racks?

A: Yes, if provided by the host property the bike racks will remain on the buses.

#### 37. Q: Can I palm the steering wheels on Turns?

A: No.

#### 38. Q: When do I have to turn on the flashers?

A: Before you back your bus at the left and right reverses and any time you back your bus.

#### 39. Q: Do hazard light have to be on in the passenger stop?

A: No. Only turn signals have to be used.

#### 40. Q: Do I apply the passenger/parking/emergency brake on passenger stops or reverses?

A: No.

#### 41. Q: Can I shift the bus from drive to reverse without going into neutral?

A: It depends on the bus type used. If in a 30' or 40' bus Yes, if in van No.

#### 42. Q: Do I open the doors at passenger stops?

A: Yes.

#### 43. Q: On the Right and Left Reverses, does the clock stop when I open the doors?

A: You do not open the doors. You will honk your horn when you have completed your backing. The clock will stop until you start forward movement.

#### 44. Q: Whenever the bus is disabled, does my time stop?

A: Yes.

#### 45. Q: If the doors are open when you drive off, will points be deducted?

A: Yes. It is a safety issue. Most buses will not let the bus move when the doors are open.

#### 46. Q: On the right and left reverses, do I need to turn on my flashers and honk my horn before backing?

A: Yes. You must use the flashers and horn at any time you back on the course.

#### 47. Q: Do I need to use my turn signals on free turns?

A: Yes. Any time you move right or left on the course, you must use your turn signals.

## 48. Q: When I back into the reverses and stop and then continue backing into the reverses, will I be penalized?

A: No, you will only be penalized if you pull forward and back in a second time.

49. Q: How will the judges know when I have completed my backing into the reverses?

A: You will honk your horn.

#### 50. Q: Do I have to compete in my uniform?

A: Yes. If applicable, you may remove your tie and coat to become more comfortable.

#### **Pre-TripInspection:**

#### 51. Q: At the Pre-Trip Inspection, will we get a count down on our time left?

A: Yes. A 2-minute, 1 minute and 30 second warning will be given.

#### 52. Q: At the Pre-Trip Inspection, can we walk around the bus and then record the defects?

A: Yes, anyway you want to do it is acceptable.

#### 53. Q: Will there be a judge writing down the defects for us as we find them?

A: No, you must write them down yourself in as legible a manner as possible.

#### 54. Q: Wheels are under the bus, aren't they? Then we don't have to check them?

A: Just don't crawl under the bus.

#### 55. Q: Will there be a similar bus to check out ahead of time?

A: Only if one is available, if not you may have time to familiarize yourself with the bus or van during pre-trip inspection.

#### 56. Q: Will the Pre-Trip Inspection be performed on a 35' or 40' bus?

A: Whichever is available.

#### 57. Q: Does checking the bus windows mean opening the windows?


